Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you in pieces. Matthew 7:6.

The principle being taught in this teaching of Jesus is clear. It means that you don't share your heart with those who are not truly your true friends. If you do, they will take what you have shared and use it to humiliate you or use it against you to manipulate you.

I believe the Church needs to learn this lesson. As the church we tend to take all people at face value, without discerning their hearts or sincerity. Then, as we wrongly believe, we feel we must share our hearts out of love for them. But this is not

God also teaches us that we should not "answer a fool according to his folly, or you will be like him yourself. [But we ought to answer a fool according to his folly, or he will be wise in his own eyes." Proverbs 26:4-5. While at first glance these two thoughts may appear to be contradictory, but they really are not. What the writer of Proverbs is telling us to do is to beware of those who have insincere motives who are asking you to share your personal thoughts. But if you do, there may be adverse consequences.

On the other hand, we are instructed to discern the motives of those we are talking to and answer them accordingly. This is what Jesus did throughout His ministry. This is why He spoke in parables. It is also why he repeatedly asked questions of those who where questioning Him before He would answer their guestions. He was getting them to reveal their true motives.

It also means that we should not expect God to reveal Himself to us in an intimate way if do not sincerely respond to His word. We wonder why He does not answer our prayers the way we think He should. But He tells us plainly in James 4:3. He says, "You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures." You see, God is not really going to reveal His heart to us, and answer our prayers, if we are not willing to submit ourselves to Him first. Maybe this is the reason that so many of us do not really experience God's love and goodness in our lives the way we would like to. If so, it is we who need to respond to God with a sincere heart if we really expect to really experience His love in a personal way.

How to prepare for drought in advance

Drought is becoming a more frequent problem. According to NASA, the last 20 years have produced some of the driest conditions in the American west on record. When drought occurs, it is now more severe and pervasive than it once was, which underscores the importance of planning for drought before it occurs.

Government efforts to combat climate change, which NASA indicates is behind the increase in drought over the last two decades, might produce large scale change needed to protect against drought. But there's also steps private homeowners can take to prepare for drought before it occurs.

Check your well pump regularly. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security urges homeowners who have a well pump on their properties to check them regularly for leaks. If the pump turns on and off while water is not being used, it has a leak. Addressing the leak promptly helps to conserve water, which is one of the most effective means to combatting drought.

Plant native species. The U.S. Forest Service notes that native plants are adapted to the local climate and soil conditions. That means they will require less water and will be hardy enough to withstand heat waves in areas where especially high summer temperatures are

Raise the blades on your lawn mower. The DHS notes that lawn mower blades raised to at least three

inches encourage grass roots to grow deeper and hold soil moisture. That can help lawns survive drought without much intervention, including extra water during times when water restrictions are in place. Reseed with

lawns drought in mind. When reseeding a lawn, consider the potential for drought. The DHS recommends individuals in areas affected or likely to be affected by drought plant drought-resistant lawn Drought-resistant grasses, which include Bermuda and Zoysia grass, can withstand prolonged periods without water. However, before reseeding, consult a local lawn and garden professional to ensure the grass will thrive in your area.

Devise a wise watering

strategy. Come late spring, devise a watering strategy to take you through the dog days of summer. Water-efficient irrigation systems can protect flowers, plants and shrubs during prolonged periods marked by little to no precipitation. In addition, less water will be lost to evaporation when watering during early morning or evening hours when temperatures tend to be less extreme and the sun is not as high. If possible, hand water during these times of day or set irrigation system timers to do so.

Dry conditions are more common today than they were 20 years ago. That reality means homeowners must plan ahead as they try to help their lawns and gardens survive drought.

How to prepare soil for spring planting

Spring is a season of rejuvenation, and perhaps nowhere is that rebirth more noticeable than in the yard. Each spring, grass begins to grow again as inviting landscapes beckon people out-

If you're planting in a small area, such as a deck planter box that still has soil from last year's planting inside it, you can either clean the box and replace the soil entirely or dig around with a handheld trowel, cultivator and/or weeder. It's important to loosen all of the soil around where you will ultimately plant prior to planting to ensure water can reach the roots and help them establish themselves once planting is completed.

Test and, if necessary, amend the soil. A simple pH test can help determine the acidity or alkalinity of the soil. This is an important step as soil that is too acidic or alkaline can decrease the

plants will need to thrive. In addition to conducting a pH test, which can be purchased at little cost at a local home improvement store, homeowners can contact their local Cooperative Extension Service to test their soil quality. These tests will reveal soil pH, but also can shed light on the texture of the soil and other components. Once the test is conducted, the local Coop Extension Service may recommend amendments to improve the nutritional quality of the soil so new plants can

Jacaranda: Instantly identifiable by its purple blooms, the jacaranda tree is native to South America, which makes it ideal in warm climates. The jacaranda tree is considered a shade tree and if or when it sheds it leaves, those leaves can typically be mowed, saving homeowners the work of raking them. However, the online home and garden resource, The Spruce, notes that jacaranda trees can require substantial maintenance when planted near surfaces where people walk, such as driveways and patios. So, when planting jacaranda trees, it's ideal to do so in locations where falling leaves will land exclusively on grass.

Japanese red maple: The Home Depot notes that the Japanese red maple are very low-maintenance trees that can adapt to various soil types and grow in an assortment of light conditions. During dry periods, however, the ADF notes the importance of keeping soil consistently moist. Various types of soil can accommodate the Japanese red maple, so this

A mossy lawn is a sign that certain conditions are ripe for the moss, but not necessarily the grass, to grow. According to Lowes, moss thrives in certain conditions, which should be addressed if homeowners hope

hospitable to grass and less addition, amending the soil friendly to moss.

Compacted soil and excess thatch can make it easier for moss to take root. These conditions also can make the soil damp and restrict drainage, something that promotes moss growth.

Moss can grow in shady conditions. If patches of the lawn have been overrun by moss, there could be too much shade in the area. Trimming back trees or shrubbery may help; otherwise. homeowners may need to look into hardscape or plants that thrive in such conditions to remedy shady and damp areas on portions of their landscapes.

Moss typically can be removed the same way one would dethatch a lawn. It involves rigorously raking or agitating the lawn to loosen the moss. This can be done by hand with a rake, or in the case of a lot of moss or a large lawn, with a dethatching blade attachment for a lawn mower.

Aerating the soil will help keep moss that was removed from returning. In

For pesky moss, Spruce suggests making a solution of one box of baking soda to two gallons of water and spraying this solution on the patches of moss. It is a natural alternative to using chemical prod-

ucts. Certain sources indi cate a glyphosate herbicide could work on moss, but the World Health Organization considers glyphosate to be a probable human carcinogen and it is prohibited in certain

Moss may be green, but it's often not the type of green homeowners desire in their lawns. Learning about moss can help when removing it and preventing it in the future.

When including perennials in the garden, make sure you wait for the right time to plant them. The ideal time is during the spring or fall. Perennials come as containergrown perennials, which already have been established in the soil. Bare-root perennials are just roots that are often packed in peat moss. In order to plant bare-root perennials, soak the roots in water for several minutes before gently planting in the ground.

Perennials should be watered deeply, especially during the first growing season. However, the soil should never be overly dry or wet.

Most perennials do not need to be fertilized heavily. A single application in the spring typically is all that's
