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
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
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Jackson County Broadband Workgroup Update

Take a simple internet speed test to help plan for future grants

Access to broadband is vital for the economic health and growth of our area. The Jackson County Broadband workgroup is leading the charge to build community support and apply for grant funds to fill the gaps in service. One of its latest efforts is to promote a simple internet speed test.

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"The speed test was announced several weeks ago, and so far we have data from 247 unique locations," stated Jeff Amo, Chair, Jackson County Board of Supervisors. "That's a great start toward our goal of 950 locations. But we need more residents to participate. What is learned through resident participation will help in future grant applications."

To take the test, residents and businesses simply need to visit the Jackson County website at <u>https://www.co.jackson.wi.us/</u> At the upper right-hand side, click on "Broadband" to go to the speed test link. It will only take a few moments and address information is protected and never shared. Take the test from your home computer. It can also be taken from cell phone wifi,but turn off your phone provider's wireless data service.

Even those residents without internet access can help by logging onto the site from a friend's home or the local library. Click on "Enter an address with No Available Service" to complete the survey.

After submission of four funding applications to the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin on March 17th, the Broadband Workgroup held an update meeting with community stakeholders on April 21st. It will be learned in early Summer if projects are funded. At an April 28th meeting, the Workgroup finalized plans to reach out to area broadband providers for collaborative talks on future projects. On May 16th, Workgroup representatives will meet with the Jackson County Town's Association. THE SHOPPER

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




