Brief Facility Description: Superior Fresh LLC is a combined aquaponics (aquaculture + hydroponics) facility raising Atlantic salmon along with leafy green vegetables annually. The water supply for the system is from two private wells. Water from the fish production system (aquaculture) is reused to raise vegetables hydroponically (aquaponic).
