SPECIAL SESSION of the JACKSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
June 22, 2026

The Special Session of the Jackson County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 5:30 P.M., on Monday, June 22, 2026, at the Jackson County Courthouse in the County Board Room by Chairman Carney.

County Clerk, Melissa Windsor, took roll call with all 19 members present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Resolution: 27-06-2026

RE: Appointment of Interim Administrative Coordinator

Chairman Carney asked Sam Bach-Hanson, Corporation Counsel to open the discussion period on this Resolution. The recommendation from Corporation Counsel is strictly with respect to ensuring proper procedure is being followed and nothing to do with what was proposed as that is ultimately a policy decision for the Board to decide. As Corporation Counsel, at this point our recommendation is that the Resolution not move forward at this time, as we are concerned about procession and issues this could create for the County down the road. There are several reasons for this, and he would note that since they received an initial draft of the Resolution on this, we did also consult with Wisconsin Counties Association and Andy Phillips who also came to the same conclusion and recommended that this not move forward at this time. Essentially what it comes down to is ensuring that the proper steps are followed to create a stand-alone Administrative Coordinator position. Currently the Jackson County Code provides for the designation of an Administrative Coordinator by the Jackson County Board pursuant to Wis. Stat. §59.034 he noted that was renumbered by the legislature to §59.19 but that provides that the Board shall designate an elected or appointed official to serve as the Administrative Coordinator, meaning the person designated unless there is a Resolution to create a stand-alone position must be an elected or appointed official within the County. Again, the Administrative Coordinator can be a stand-alone position, but this should be accomplished through the creation of a position description consistent with past County practice for positions and the recruitment procedure as outlined in Chapter 4 in the County Code and the employee handbook. Our other concern as far as procedure is with respect to the compensation component. Our concern is that it meets the threshold that would require a budget amendment which would require additional notices and a two-thirds vote threshold to be done. Predominately for those reasons we would recommend that the Board, if they want to move forward with creating a stand-alone Administrative Coordinator position go through the process, bring it to committee, have a position description put together and through a budget amendment and or the budgetary process and if approved have the financing effective that way. Discussion took place. Numerous Supervisors spoke for and against the Resolution.

Supervisor Chamberlain made a motion to postpone the Resolution, to get it back to Executive and Finance, with HR Director guidance and recommendations. This was seconded by Supervisor Rolbiecki. More discussion took place. Supervisor Laurent stated that there was a lot of discussion without ever bringing the Resolution to the floor. Supervisor Laurent made a motion to adopt, and this was seconded by Supervisor Peloquin. Corporation Counsel Sam Bach-Hanson stated that a motion to postpone would need to be made prior to a motion to adopt. Corporation Counsel said at this point it was up to the Chairman. Supervisor Chamberlain reiterated his motion to postpone and that was seconded by Supervisor Rolbiecki. Roll Call vote was taken on the motion to postpone with 14 present voting Aye and 5 present voting No (Supervisor Holen, Supervisor Strandberg, Supervisor Laurent, Supervisor Peloquin, and Supervisor Richardson). Motion to postpone passed.

Supervisor Hart made a motion to adjourn. This was seconded by Supervisor Kunes. All present voted Aye by voice vote. Meeting adjourned at 5:46 P.M.
