DISTRICT NO. 1, JACK-
SON COUNTY, WISCON-
SIN**

The Board of the Brockway Sanitary District NO. 1, Jackson County, Wisconsin, ordains as follows:
SECTION 1:

Items A and B of Section D of Section 4 of the Code of Ordinances for the Brockway Sanitary District No. 1 are hereby repealed entirely and recreated to read as follows:

a) **SAND AND GREASE TRAP INSTALLATIONS.** Grease, fats, oil, and sand interceptors shall be provided and in place at all establishments of a commercial and industrial manner, including, but not limited to, repair garages/shops, gasoline/fuel stations, car washes, and restaurants for the proper handling of liquid wastes containing grease, fats, oil, flammable wastes, sand, and other harmful ingredients. All interceptors shall be constructed in accordance with the Wisconsin Plumbing Code and shall be located so as to be readily and easily accessible for cleaning and inspection. All grease, fats, oil, and sand interceptors shall be regularly maintained by the owner/proprietor, at owner/proprietor's expense, and be in continuous and efficient operation at all times. Commencing upon the date this Ordinance be-

comes effective under law the owner/proprietor shall record, on forms approved by the Sanitary District, all sand, fats, and grease trap inspections and cleaning services performed. Each entry recorded shall include the date, type of service, quantities of material removed and disposition of material removed. Each recorded service shall also include the signature of the responsible party or responsible servicing agency representative. The owner/proprietor will be required to provide records and documentation to the Brockway Town Hall within twenty-four (24) hours of the time the sand, fats, and/or grease trap is serviced. Said documentation must include the total and available capacity of the sand, fats, and/or grease trap at the time of servicing and the servicing agency's recommendation for the frequency of future servicing of the same. All such records shall be available for inspection by the Sanitary District upon written request at any time. In addition to the above-listed requirements, all such commercial and industrial establishments shall be required to submit to the Sanitary District an annual report summarizing all sand, fats, and/or grease trap inspections and cleaning services performed in the calendar year. Said report shall be due no later than January 10th of each year summarizing all such activity in the prior calendar year and shall be provided on the form authorized by the Sanitary District.

b) **PENALTIES.** In addition to all other remedies available to the Sanitary District, any party who vio-

lates any part of this Section shall be subject to a daily fine of \$300.00 with each day of continuing violation being a separate violation.
SECTION II: CONFLICT
In the event of any conflict between the terms of this ordinance and any applicable state statute, the applicable state statute shall control.

EFFECTIVE DATE**
This ordinance shall become effective upon its publication and/or posting in the manner set forth in s. 60.80, Wis. Stats.
